## The Road to Bethlehem

On Tuesday 1 December St Agnes Catholic High School came together as a community to celebrate the re-enactment of the Nativity. Starting at 9am the school came together on the back playground which had been set up to visually represent the temple in Jerusalem, the Bethlehem streetscape by night, Persia and Nazareth. Students relived the story that not all are familiar with but which is so important for the Catholic faith.

As a Catholic school the story of Jesus, his birth, death and resurrection are so important that we must retell it and emphasise the importance of each aspect of such a great life. The story leading up to the birth of Jesus came to life with Herod, Zecariah and Elizabeth, Anne and Joachim (Mary's parents), Arch Angel Gabriel, the annunciation, the visitation, and the Maggi from the East. In retelling the story the additional characters (animals) helped to show the simplicity of the birth of Jesus and the majesty by which this baby was held in esteem by the Maggi, the shepherds with their sheep who added a greater sense of reality, the donkey that carried Mary to Bethlehem to the stable where Jesus was born and the camels which carried the 3 Maggi - Melciour, Casper and Balthazar to see the new born king were majestic and added another layer to the re-enactment.

This year we invited 5 local Catholic Primary Schools to view the performance. Students in year 4 from Sacred Heart, Holy Family and St Aidan's were mesmerised and captured by the story of Jesus' birth.

We will recreate the nativity for the students again in 2016, not only for St Agnes, but for our surrounding schools as well and hopefully be able to share this occasion with our families.

Australian Catholic Youth Festival 3-5 DECEMBER ADELAIDE 2015

A small contingent of Year 9 students travelled to Adelaide, South Australia, on Thursday 3 December to participate in the Catholic Youth Festival.

Martin Mangahas, Piadora Rahme, Gabrielle Norton and Angelika Ball were all unsure, and nervous, about what to expect at the festival but after the first plenary session they were very enthusiastic to see what was in store during the remainder of the weekend. Below are some students' reflections of the experience...

The experience at ACYF was quite a memorable one. I will never forget the first time I walked into the first plenary we were apart of. There were thousands of youth in there for God. I watched everyone in praise and it warmed my heart. Now truthfully, raised in a Catholic family, I would say my faith beforehand was quite strong. But in a way, something was missing. This experience made me wonder about my faithfulness, loyalty and how much time I gave to God and even though we think things are 'enough' it never actually is. There is always more we can give to God and I think that's what was missing in me, the will to do more. The conference also taught me one extremely significant thing; no matter how broken, how messed up we are as individuals, God can do something magnificent out for you.

My favourite speakers were Father Rob Galea, Jason Evert and Steve Angrisano. All three had a way of connecting with the youth that I have never encountered before and this really changed my perspective on things. They taught me to allow God to love and speak to us and to open up our hearts. This really moved me.

## From Martin Mangahas

As I had never heard of an Australian Catholic Youth Festival since recently, I had very few ideas and expectations from the festival. The expectations I had were all based on the information I received on the orientation night. I expected the festival to be held in a very traditional Catholic way with about twenty Bishops who were going to be at the venue. I also anticipated a lot of masses and liturgies throughout the three days and lectures about key Catholic principles from the priests. Moreover, I discovered that people like Fr Rob Galea, who was a former X Factor contestant, and Jason Evert, a renowned speaker from the USA, were going to be present at the festival which made me very keen to. Overall, I had a general sense of high expectations from the festival in terms of fun and spiritual nourishment.

The festival experience, however, greatly exceeded my expectations. From the opening plenary to the closing mass, there was a never-ending vibe of excitement greatly due to the sense of knowing that three and a half thousand youths from all over the country share the same faith as you. The festival took a very contemporary approach and therefore was very engaging to the youth as Bishops took 'selfies', priests played with the nuns in a game of fooseball and rock music was played in plenary sessions. I strongly believe that this is evidence that the Church established, by the Apostles of Jesus two thousand years ago, is very dynamic and can be given a modern, more youthful approach while still keeping the same principles and teachings since the past two millennia.

Overall, I believe that the three days I spent at ACYF are well spent and will stay in my memories for many years to come. My top three best moments was Jason Evert's What's so great about being Catholic?, Steve Angrisano's Go Make A Difference and Fr Rob Galea's A work in progress. Not only did I enjoy the songs and dancing but I also felt a more deeper and stronger bond with God throughout the three days. I believe that now I have the mission to share this experience with others, as I really want others to feel the same way I felt during these three days.







## From Piadora Rahme

On the 3<sup>rd</sup> December, I, along with three other students, had the opportunity to attend a three-day festival regarding our Catholic faith.

My experience at the Australian Catholic Youth Festival in Adelaide is one of the most memorable Catholic pilgrims I have been a participant of. These singers performed hymns in the plenaries and workshops, which were accompanied with a homily-like, talk expanding certain themes they were exploring.

Overall, I found the experience at the Australian Catholic Youth Festival a very knowledgeable, inspirational and fascinating gathering for 3,500 other young Christians who sought new ways to praise God. It opened up a unique method of connecting with God and taught me a range of valuable life lessons which I will carry everyday for the rest of my life. The enriching program will resume again in a few years time in Sydney, which I am definitely considering applying for.


