Year 7 Camp

Dear Parents/Guardians,

The Year 7 Camp is an integral part of St Agnes Catholic High School's pastoral program and attendance is compulsory. The following is an outline of the arrangements that have been made for the 2019 camp.

There will be a three day camp with overnight stays at the Outdoor Education Experience Centre at Morisset from Wednesday 20th March to Friday 22nd March 2019. We will leave school at 8.15am on the Wednesday morning and travel by bus to Morisset. Students will be staying in on-site accommodation units and will return to school on Friday 22nd March in time to catch the afternoon school buses. Contact details of the campgrounds, etc can be found within the accompanying notes. The camp program is run by trained instructors. Students will be supervised at all times by St Agnes staff. The cost of the camp, which has been included on your child's school fees account, covers the cost of accommodation, meals, all activities and transport. Please note that if your child does not attend camp the cost will not be refunded. Please arrange a meeting with Ms Gale if your child is unable to attend.

Students must bring a mess kit, all toiletries, towels (beach and bath), a torch, a hat, swimwear, sunscreen, a sleeping bag (or sheets and a pillowcase) and a pencil case with basic stationery supplies. (Please also refer to Gear Checklist). If a student requires medication it is to be given to Ms Gale on the morning of departure with full instructions on usage. All parents are asked to complete and return both the liability release and medical consent forms. Students are encouraged not to bring any valuables such as iPads, devices, mobile phones, etc. The campsite phone number has been provided if students need to be contacted in the case of an emergency. NB: Students who choose to bring any of the above mentioned devices and are found to be using them during activities, meal times or after 'lights out' will have them confiscated for the remainder of the camp.

Students are expected to act in a responsible manner at all times while on camp. (Refer to the school diary pages vi and vii) and the Declaration Form. If a student does not follow these guidelines, parents will be contacted and asked to pick up their son / daughter from the campsite.

The camp is an important part of your son's/daughter's transition to secondary school and all students are expected to attend. Please do not hesitate to contact Ms Gale if you have any enquiries, suggestions or concerns.

Attached to this letter are a Parent & Student letter, Guidelines and Gear checklist and a Medical, Activity Restriction and Consent form. Please complete the Medical, Activity Restriction and Consent form and the Liability Release note and ask your son / daughter to return them to his / her Learning Advisor by **Tuesday 5th March.**
