The season of Advent begins this week and continues through the four Sundays of Advent and ends at Christmas Eve. The first week of Advent focuses on the return of the Lord and the following weeks focus more specifically on the anticipation of the birth of Jesus. Rather than simply commemorating an historical event, Advent is a time of preparing our hearts to 'receive' Jesus into the world each year. Advent is traditionally marked by the colour of violet - the same colour as used in Lent.

By the time the Church begins to celebrate Advent as a period of preparation towards Christmas, the stores have been filling with Christmas paraphernalia for weeks. It starts out small with a few decorations and wrapping paper and eventually takes over every retail outlet.

Stay awake! With these words, Jesus cautions his disciples to be constantly vigilant and to be alert to the return of the Lord. It is a very fitting way to begin the season of Advent. Advent has traditionally been observed as a time of preparation and waiting. It culminates in the Christmas season and so the waiting and preparation is related to the celebration of the coming of Christ into the world.

Perhaps the time of preparation this Advent is also a call to stay awake and stay alert in faith. One of the great challenges to faith today is the complacency that has taken hold of many in our society. When life is comfortable, the perceived need for faith appears to diminish. The Gospel call to stay awake in preparation for the coming of the Lord is a call to continue the work of bringing about the Kingdom of God. Awake to what is happening around us in the world and awake to what is happening within us. Especially as our lives become extremely hectic and chaotic during the festive season and the end of the school year.

Year 10 Record of Student Achievement (RoSA)

On Wednesday, 9 December, Year 10 students will be able to access their RoSA grades via the Students Online facility (<http://studentsonline.bos.nsw.edu.au/>) provided by the Board of Studies Teaching & Educational Standards NSW (BOSTES). Year 10 students should become familiar with this website as it will provide them with a wealth of information as they enter Years 11 & 12.

When using the system, students will be able to access an electronic record of their Year 10 grades that can be generated into a PDF document and downloaded. A formal RoSA certificate will only be provided to students who have indicated to the school that they are leaving the school system at the end of the year to undertake either an apprenticeship or full time employment. It is hoped that all Year 10 students take the time to reflect on their results and begin planning ways that they can improve for next year.

Transition to Year 11

Over the next week our Year 10 students will be visiting Loyola Senior High School as part of their Year 11 Orientation Program for 2016. Students will experience the elective subjects they have selected for their final two years of schooling, as well as visit the Trade Training Centre for those who have elected this pathway.

Commencing a new school with new teachers, studying different subjects and receiving greater amounts of homework and assessment tasks will all be part of a senior students experience next year. The transition from Year 10 to Year 11 can be quite an overwhelming one for many students, particularly if they do not have effective study skills in place to cope with these demands.

Students who are successful in the Higher School Certificate years of study are those who are committed to their studies and have excellent time management strategies in place. Students who are able to remain focused and eliminate any distractions should be able to succeed. Developing positive study habits early in Year 11 will hold students in good stead towards meeting the many challenges presented to them throughout their final Higher School Certificate year.

Gospel Reflection Sunday November 22, 2015

Christ the King

I was reading the reflection from "The Word Among Us", a Catholic devotional online website, which expressed beautifully Sunday's Gospel. I have included some of it here for you -

What a beautiful picture John paints of Jesus, the King we celebrate today! He is the "firstborn," "faithful," "ruler" who has "made us into a kingdom" (Revelation 1:5, 6).

Reading this passage, we might come away with the idea that as King, Jesus has everything sewn up. He is enthroned in glory, and we are enjoying our life in his kingdom.

But that's not exactly how things are, is it? We know there is still suffering in the world. We know there is still sin in the world. We even know there is still sin and temptation in our own lives! It seems like a contradiction, doesn't it?

Not really. While Jesus truly is the King of kings and Lord of lords, he has not yet come back to take full possession of his kingdom. And that means that his enemy, the devil, is still out there, engaging us in a battle with his lies and temptations. His main strategy is to conquer us through complacency. He knows that if he can fill our minds with doubt, worry, and self-centered thoughts, we'll become indifferent to God. We'll also become dull to the Holy Spirit's presence and live only for ourselves.

This is why the Mass is so important. At Mass, we remember and celebrate the power of Jesus' resurrection. But even more than that, we receive Jesus in the form of bread and wine. He comes to feed us with his grace and his power so that we can be strengthened for the battle. His word helps us stay clear-minded, and his Body and Blood give us divine grace and favour.

So when you come to Mass, come with an open heart. Come before your King, and let him feed your heart and your mind. Come and confess that his grace is the only way you can possibly win the battle. Call on him, and he will come to your defense.

"All hail to you, King Jesus! You are my comfort in affliction and my strength in battle!"

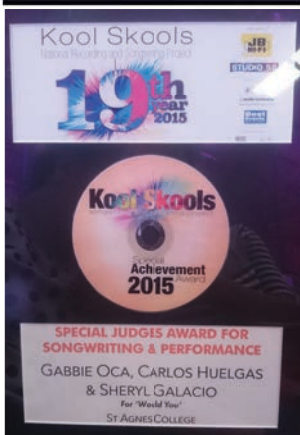

NEW BUSWAYS TIMETABLE FOR WESTERN SYDNEY

Commencing **Sunday 29 November 2015**, all **Busways services in Western Sydney** will have **new timetables**. These feature revised departure, arrival and trip times, to improve reliability and maintain train connections. This will also mean new accessible trips across the network. These changes could affect your connections with the school buses.

Changes to SSTS applications and the introduction of the School Opal card.

The School Student Transport Scheme (SSTS) gives eligible students free or subsidised travel between home and school, on the approved train, bus or ferry services.

From term one 2016, Transport for NSW will be issuing School Opal cards to students eligible for travel under the School Student Transport Scheme via a new online application process.

The introduction of the new School Opal card and online application form will provide significant benefits for schools:

Automatic renewal

Most parents, guardians and students won't need to apply for a School Opal card if they have already been given a school student travel pass and will automatically receive a School Opal card in 2016.

However, parents, guardians and students will need to apply if the student:

- is just starting school and has not had a pass before
- is in a transition year (i.e., year 2 to 3, or 6 to 7)
- is changing schools, including going between primary and secondary school
- or, if the student's personal details have changed (e.g. address).

Reduced distribution

While School Opal cards will automatically sent to schools for existing pass holders for distribution for travel in term one, all new applications received for travel from the start of 2016 will be sent directly to the student's nominated address.

Online application form

Schools will no longer need to keep the SSTS application form as parents, guardians and students can go online from 2 November 2015 to complete their application form, print it out and return it to the school.

Fewer forms

Schools will only need to endorse a single application form for each student's eligible address and send it to a single address (Locked Bag 5085, Parramatta 2124) even if they are applying for multiple services.

Simplified replacement process

Schools won't need to endorse additional applications for lost, stolen or damaged passes, as parents, guardians and students simply need to visit www.transportnsw.info/school-students or call 131 500 to order a

new School Opal card. Schools can continue to follow their current processes for students who have lost their pass.

Online eligibility assessment

The new online application portal will automatically assess eligibility based on distance rules.

Same eligibility rules

The eligibility rules for subsidised school travel remain the same for travel inside and outside the Opal network. Students may need to live a minimum distance away their school:

- Years K-2 (Infants) there's no minimum distance.
- Years 3-6 (Primary) 1.6km straight line distance or 2.3km walking distance or further.
- Years 7-12 (Secondary) 2.0km straight line distance or 2.9km walking distance or further.

How you can help?

- Display the enclosed poster on the school noticeboard.
- Distribute the flyers to students and parents.
- Encourage applicants to go online to apply for 2016 travel in the Opal network via your communication channels. The application is available at transportnsw.info/school-students. Paper forms that have already been completed and submitted to Transport for NSW or a transport operator will be processed and do not need to be resubmitted.
- Responsibly dispose of any remaining blue SSTS application forms.
- Add digital tiles and banners to add to your website when they arrive via email.

Olympic Park Wetlands – Year 8 Geography Excursion

Tuesday, 24 November, half of the Year 8 cohort ventured out on a Wetlands expedition.

The Olympic Park Educators treated our intrepid geographers with care and professionalism and our students responded with enthusiasm. They were engaged, excited and well behaved.

We learned about the history of the Wetlands, its uses and abuses of the land in Homebush Bay and finally, we learned about the value of this unique environment and the need to protect it.

Students tasted the leaves of mangrove trees, tested the ph levels and acidity of the water. They measured the humidity in the rain the strength of the wind and the temperature of the wetlands. They analysed and recorded the flora and fauna and learned how natural filters such as reeds help to clean the storm water polluted by industry.

Both teachers and students enjoyed the day and were grateful for their learned guides who obviously had a passion for what they do.

Many thanks to the Year 8 students and their supportive teachers, Mrs Beckett, Mrs Copping, Mr Azzopardi and Mr Sadsad.

How To Install Skoolbag On Your Smartphone

For iPhone and iPad users:

1. Click the "App Store" icon on your Apple device.
2. Type your school name in the search, using school name will help.
3. You will see your school appear, click "Get" then "Install".
4. The app is FREE to download.
5. When installed click "Open".
6. Select "OK" to receive push notifications, when asked.
7. Click the "Allow" button on the bottom right of the App, then "Setup".
8. Toggle on the Push Categories that are applicable for you by tapping the switch.

For Android users:

You must first have signed up with a Google Account before installing the app.

1. Click the "Play Store" button on your Android Device.
2. Click the magnifying glass icon at the top and type in your school name, using school name will help.
3. Click the school name when it appears in the search.
4. Click the "Install" button.
5. Click "Accept" for various permissions (please note, we do not modify any of your personal data on your device).
6. Click "Open" when installed.
7. Click the "Allow" button on the bottom right of the App, then "Setup".
8. Toggle on the Push Categories that are applicable for you by tapping the switch.

Please Note: Some brands of Android phones need the setting in "Notification Manager" changed to "Allow" instead of "Notify" in order for the push notifications to work. The phone must also be running at least version 4 system software to run the app.

For Windows 8.1 Phone and Windows 8.1 or 10 device users:

1. Go to the Windows Store on your 8.1 Windows Phone or Windows 8.1/10 Device.
2. Search for "Skoolbag" in the keyword app search.
3. Install the Skoolbag app.
4. Find your school either by using the keyword search or location service.
5. Click the "Get" icon to get the school file to your Windows Phone home screen.
6. Click the "Allow" button on the bottom right of the App, then "Setup".
