From the Assistant Principal, Mr Peter Regan

Welcome to the 2015 school year at St Agnes Catholic High School. In particular, we extend a very warm welcome to our Year 7 families and our new families to the St Agnes community.

The purpose of this article is to provide our families with a variety of information regarding the expectations of our students. At the front of the student diary these expectations are explained. As partners in the education of your sons/daughters we rely on your support and assistance to ensure these expectations are achieved. In the diary there are two specific areas that need to be read and signed by your child and yourself as part of this agreement. They are located on pages viii and xii.

Safety:

The safety and well being of your child is our highest priority. Parents are reminded that there is NO SUPERVISION for students prior to 7.40am. Similarly, there is no supervision of students after 3:00pm. We encourage parents to use the drop-off and pick up areas outside the school and not to stop for extended periods of time. We recommend that if you pick up your child on Evans Road you instruct your child to cross at the designated crossing point. Please be aware of our neighbours and do not park across their driveways.

Attendance:

Students must attend school and arrive at lessons on time. Students are to be at school by 8:10am ready to commence Homeroom at 8:15am. Parents are asked to ensure that students have travel arrangements in place, which allow them to be at school by 8:10am. If they arrive after 8.15am they are required to bring a late note with them explaining the reason for the lateness.

Leave from School:

Any parent wishing to take their child out of school for an extended time, for reasons other than illness, are required to seek approval from the Principal by completing an exemption form (available from the school office or from our from the school office or from our website.)

Parents wanting to pick up their son/daughter early from school are required

to provide a note documenting this request. Students must present it to their relevant Stage Coordinator well in advance of the time of pick up.

Uniform Policy:

As you would be aware when you enrolled your child at St Agnes we actively promotes high standards of uniform and presentation from our students. Uniform requirements are clearly listed in the school diary and are regularly communicated to students at school assemblies, stage meetings and parents in the newsletter and information evenings.

Mobile Phones:

The use of a mobile phone by students during school time is NOT permitted. The Student Management Guidelines, outlined in the school diary, state that a mobile phone will be confiscated if used within the school grounds. Parents will be contacted to collect the phone in person. Any student that needs to make a call must do so through the student office.

Similarly, parents who need to contact students, for any reason, should do so through the school office on 8882 0744.

During the year there may be times when you would like to contact a member of staff but are not sure as to whom to contact. From the Teaching & Learning Co-ordinator, Mr Laurence De Martin

Students have received their individual timetable and are to be commended on the positive start they have made to the 2015 academic year. Copies of these timetables, as well as equipment lists for 2015, are available on the school Moodle. (bit.ly/stagnes)

Years 7-10 Assessment Handbooks, which outline the school policy in regards to the completion and submission of assessment tasks, as well as the assessment schedules for each subject, will soon be available on the Moodle. It is a good idea to go through the Assessment Handbook with your child and ensure that they are aware of assessment expectations and submission dates for tasks.

This year sees the continuation of the new National Curriculum into Years 8 & 10, with students in these year groups undertaking new courses in English, Mathematics, Science and Australian History. All students in Years 7-10 are now studying from the new curriculum.

Students in Years 9 & 10 will have the opportunity, during Week 3, to see me regarding possibly changing their elective subjects for this year. A reminder, there is no guarantee students will be able to make any changes. Changes can only occur if there is a vacancy in the elective class they wish to join.

All students should be setting realistic learning goals that they plan to achieve this academic year. This practice is best done on a semester basis and involves students identifying subject areas they have experienced past

difficulties in and examining ways which they can improve and achieve their personal best. If students do not have good study habits, it will be hard for them to achieve. Trying to implement the 10 study habits below could see students learning capacity grow.

- Keep your study desk and materials organised and tidy.
- 2. Schedule your study time and stick to it!
- Set short-term goals for each study session and reward yourself when you meet those goals.
- Read the chapter on information that will be covered the following day. Write down any questions you have that pertain to the subject.
- Make it a point to try and use new terms and concepts in order for them to really sink in.
- 6. Do not study for hours on end. Study for 45 minutes and then take 15 minutes off.
- 7. Try and correspond your class notes and textbook/online information.
- 8. Make sure to cut out all distractions when studying: phones, TV, iPods, surfing the net, loud areas, etc.
- Go to bed after you study. Your brain will mull over what you just learned while you sleep. There will be a good chance you will remember it pretty well when you wake up.
- 10. Keep a positive attitude about your studies. If you find yourself dreading your studies, change your attitude and think how exciting it is to learn something new!

I hope that all students enjoy, participate and succeed in their studies this year.

From the Counsellor Mr Paul Smith

Starting secondary school is a time of change and uncertainty, which places new demands on young people. Being the youngest in the school, when they used to be the eldest, getting used to new subjects and teachers, as well as forming new friendships are just some of the challenges our new Year 7's face while settling into our St Agnes community.

Whilst most Year 7's will take these new experiences in their stride it is natural to experience some difficulty, particularly as it's accompanied by the potentially unsettling transition from child-hood to adolescence.

It helps to remember the 3 P's to assist your child to settle in:

- 1. Patience Be patient and understanding in the early weeks. Brush up on your listening skills as you help your child to adjust. Talk to your child about change and reassure them that it is normal to feel nervous in new circumstances. Let them know that many of the difficulties they face will be temporary.
- 2. Positive Attitude Confidence is catching so make sure you see this transition time as exciting challenge that you and your child can handle rather than an event to be feared. Ask them about their new subjects or interesting activities they are doing and try to shift their focus to the positive aspects of school. Encourage them to discuss any problems with the Learning Advisor. **Assistant** Stage Coordinator Stage or ordinator. These people have great strategies to help your child settle into school and are more than happy to help.

3. Process their day - Some young people may come with fairly exaggerated accounts of secondary school that may not always paint a fair picture. They can be sensitive to many things, which they would have shrugged off in primary school. It helps if you can listen without judgment and show a real interest in their new school.

Although secondary school may seem a little foreign to those used to the relative intimacy of primary school, one aspect is the same - outcomes for students are maximised when schools and parents work together in the best interest of the student.

Most importantly, talk your child's new school up, rather than talking it down as kids of all ages take their cues from the most significant adults in their lives - their parents and carers!



A. Diocesan Fees

These fees are set by, and collected on behalf of the Diocese of Parramatta and are passed onto the Catholic Education Office. They are directed towards supplementing Commonwealth and State Grants (which cover about 80% of the running costs of the schools) for the payment of teacher's salaries, general running costs associated with the school and the administration of the Catholic Education Office Parramatta.

Sibling reductions for Diocesan School Fees only apply to those children attending Systemic schools in the Diocese of Parramatta and St Dominic's College at Kingswood or systemic schools in the Archdiocese of Sydney and Dioceses of Wollongong and Broken Bay.

SKIRT REQUIREMENTS

Girls are to ensure:

- their skirt button is worn on the left hand side of their waist and the label is at the back of the garment.
- the temporary stitching at the hem is removed to release the pleats.
- the length of the girls skirt is NOT shortened as it is intended that it be worn below the knee.
- skirts are NOT rolled over at the waist as this affects the hang of the skirt.

A few helpful hints to ensure the good presentation of the skirt:

- Skirts need to be dry cleaned, hand washed, or washed on a wool cycle only.
- The shape of the skirt holds best if it is hung on a hanger to dry.
- To ensure the pleats fall correctly it is best to press down both the hem and pleats. This works best using a damp cloth when ironing.

SCHOOL BAG

The St Agnes school bag is a compulsory part of the school uniform

WEARING OF SCHOOL UNIFORM

Correct school uniform is to be worn travelling to and from the school while at school and at any formal occasion designated by the Principal. The school uniform should be clean and neat at all times.

- School cap or hat
- School tracksuit
- School sport shirt with crest
- School shorts
- White ankle length School socks
- Clean lace up joggers

GROOMING

Students are expected to keep their hair clean, neat and tidy at all times. Students are to keep their hair off the face and out of their eyes. Long hair below the shoulders should be tied back. All hair accessories are to be black. There are to be no extremes of fashion in hairstyle, cut, colour or accessories. The Assistant Principal will make the final decision on what is extreme.

- · No makeup or nail polish is to be worn.
- · Boys must be clean-shaven.

JEWELLERY

In the interest of safety and security, no inappropriate jewellery should be worn. Body studs, chains or bracelets are not permitted. Inappropriate jewellery will be confiscated, secured in the School Office and returned to parents or at the end of the term. Only the following may be worn.

- · A simple wrist watch
- A plain gold or silver ring (with no elevations, stones or sharp points)
- A plain gold or silver chain with a Christian cross or Christian medal (to be worn underneath the shirt)
- One pair of plain gold or silver sleepers or small studs without stones, one in the lobe of each ear.
 (Boys are permitted an appropriate earring in one earlobe only.)

OTHER

Students may wear their sports uniform including tracksuit to and from school on their designated Sports and Double PDHPE days.

In Terms 1 and 4 the tracksuit is optional.

All items of uniform must be clearly marked with student's name.

Parents may be contacted to bring in the correct uniform if students are inappropriately dressed.



Our Have a go, Share and eValuate iPad Program

In 2012, St Agnes launched it's, "Have a go, Share and eValuate" (HSV) iPad program. The purpose of the HSV iPad program is to prepare, educate and guide staff and students to confidently use the iPad as an educational tool. At the core of the HSV program is a parent funded 1:1 iPad program.

iPads have already proven themselves as a robust, practical and functional mobile device in the entertainment and business arenas. The HSV program will identify and implement the educational features of the iPad across all subject areas. At St Agnes we believe in a 21st Century education that is connected with, and influenced by, the wider St Agnes and educational communities. By using the iPad in mainstream classes our students and teachers will be able to connect and interact with these communications more efficiently.

Our recommended model

Our minimal recommended iPad models and cases are:

16GB iPad 4 with Wi-Fi placed in a full coverage case*

OR

16GB iPad Air (also known as an iPad 5) with Wi-Fi placed in a full coverage case*

An iPad Mini is not recommended as this model has a reduced display and typing surface, which is not suitable for use at St Agnes Catholic High School.

*A 'full coverage case' is a case that covers the front and back of the device and includes an inbuilt stand.

Suggested full coverage cases:

"Otterbox" or "Toughest Cases" (click on the link for extra information)

We also recommend that any purchased iPad that is used at the school is registered with an AppleCare Protection Plan. This will extend your one-year warranty and 90 days technical support. You can access these at any time. Visit AppleCare Protection Plans for more information.

iTunes

To use an iPad effectively and install Apps onto it you need an iTunes account. Students are expected to have access to an iTunes account.

Setting up an account is easy and can be done without an iTunes card or using a credit card. The parent can set up the account for the student or by the student themself. You must be over the age of 13 to hold an iTunes account.

Selecting our Educational Apps

As you are aware at the centre of our 1:1 iPad program is our commitment to integrate the iPad into a mobile educational device that will assist the teaching and learning of our students.

Part of this process involved selecting, investigating and evaluating what educational Apps we utilise within our teaching programs and assessment tasks.

Above is an App list Year 8 students are required to have download in 2015. Every App listed has been evaluated by our Emerging Technologies Coordinator, the appropriate subject Teaching and Learning Coordinator and the students in our Technology Group. Each App was judged against a criterion to ascertain its educational benefit to our students. Only those Apps that scored highly on this criterion are included on our Year 8 App List.

Casper

St Agnes uses a Mobile Device Management tool called Casper to help manage iPads used within the school.

For this management to occur students must first enrol their iPad in Casper.

Students can enrol iPads into Casper at any time (such as if they wipe their iPads and need to re-enrol it in Casper) by following the instructions located on our Moodle homepage.

Casper helps St Agnes to manage what online content our students can access via our wireless network and if needed we can locate misplaced devices.







Responsible Use Policy

Our Information and Communication Technology - Responsible Use Policy is located on page viii of the student diary. At the start of the year, every student in our community is required to read and sign this policy. This policy guides our students to determine what is acceptable conduct when using our Information and Communication Technology resources.

In particular, this policy highlights that Jailbroken devices are NOT permitted at St Agnes. When a device is Jailbroken the user will be able to download paid apps for free and customise their device in breach of Apple's User Agreement. Having devices that are Jailbroken on our network is illegal and could place our security at risk

At St Agnes Catholic High School we will always strive to create a safe and inclusive learning environment that is guided by appropriate Digital Citizenship Guidelines that are influenced by the wider digital world. For example, as a community we need to recognise the importance of App Age Restrictions. Apple's App store places age restrictions on their Apps to ensure the purchaser is aware of the App's adult content and unsafe communication methods.

The popular messaging App 'Kik Messenger' is one such App that has a 17+ App Age Restriction. At the start of the year we identified the potential dangers of this insecure App and ask our students to remove this App from their iPads.
